

Sailship Training and Learning for life Trainee/Participant Code of Behaviour Growing friendships through kindness, respect, and shared purpose

1. Purpose

This Code sets out the standards of behaviour expected from all participants in Sailship activities. It helps ensure that everyone feels safe, valued, and empowered to take part fully.

2. Our Shared Values

We ask all participants to uphold the spirit of Sailship by embracing:

- Kindness Treating others with compassion and patience
- Respect Valuing differences and personal boundaries
- Inclusion Welcoming everyone, regardless of background or ability
- Responsibility Taking care of ourselves, each other, and our shared spaces
- **Joy** Celebrating small wins, creativity, and connection

3. Expected Behaviour

Participants agree to:

- Be courteous and supportive to others
- Use respectful language and avoid shouting or swearing
- Follow instructions from staff and volunteers
- Take part in activities safely and at their own pace
- · Respect personal space and belongings
- Ask for help when needed and offer help when appropriate
- Keep shared spaces tidy and treat equipment with care
- Celebrate each other's efforts and achievements

4. Boundaries

To protect everyone's wellbeing, participants must not:

- Engage in bullying, teasing, or discriminatory behaviour
- Use mobile phones or devices in a disruptive way
- Bring alcohol, drugs, or dangerous items to sessions
- Share personal information about others without consent
- Take photos or videos without permission

5. Safeguarding & Support
